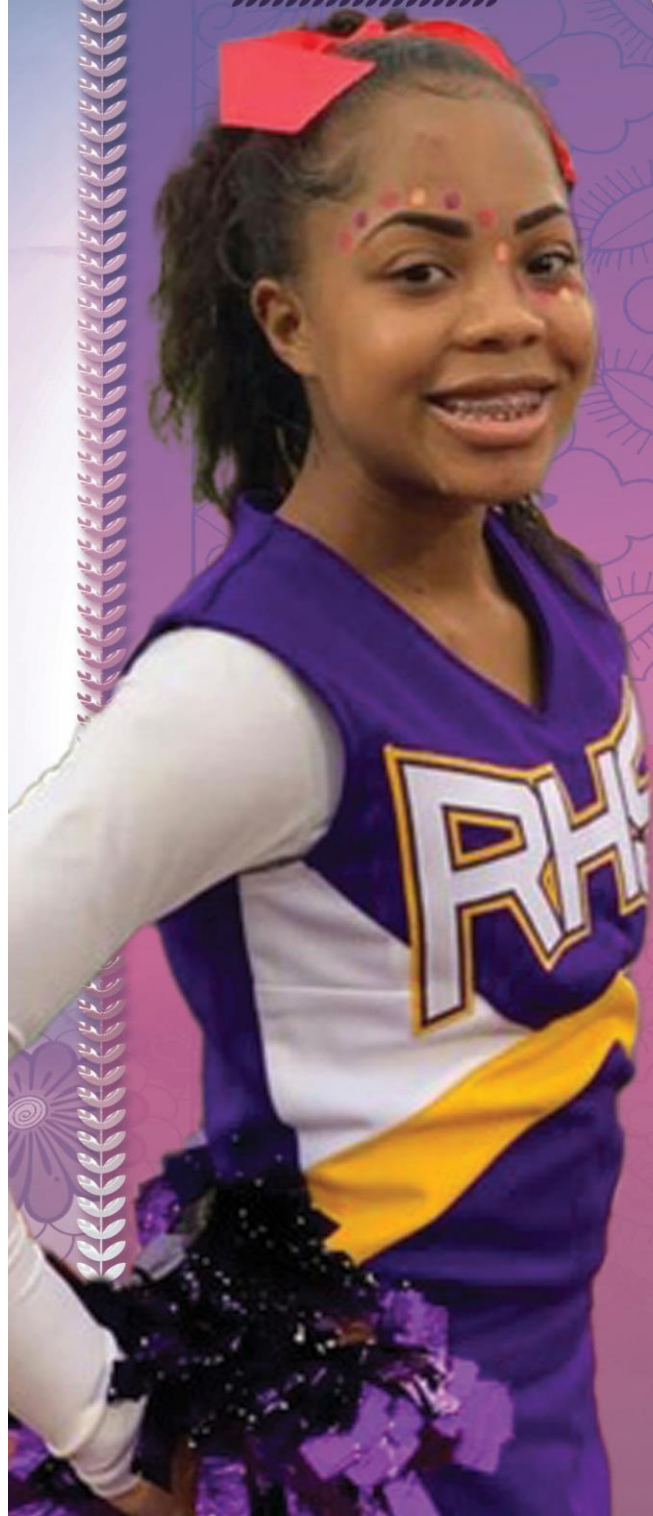

Good friends, good time, a loved ones touch.

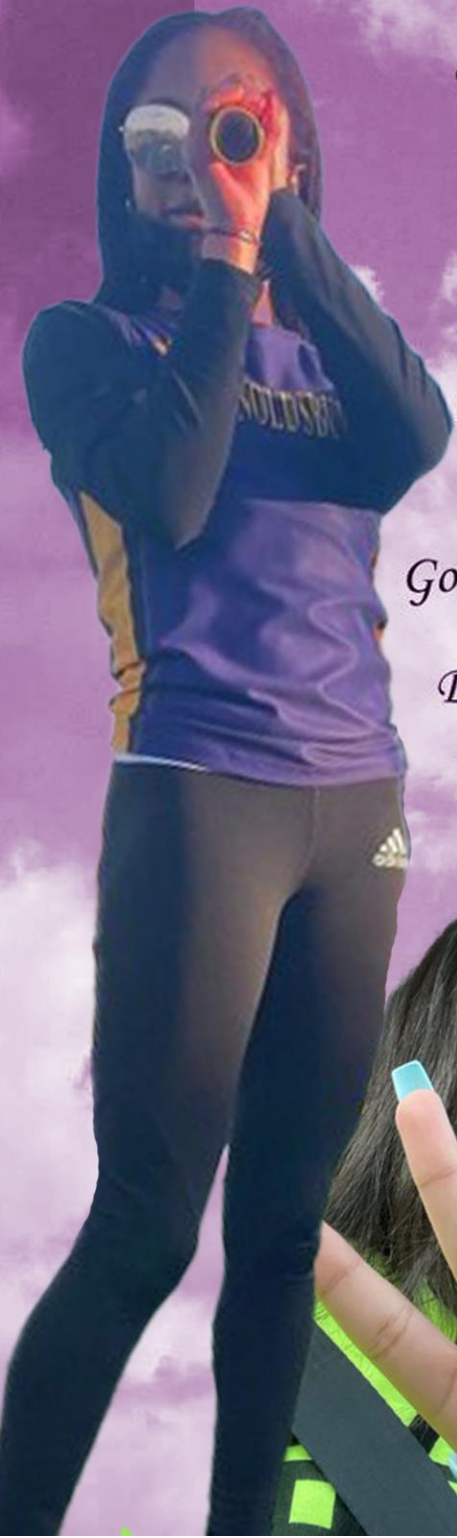
Perhaps my time seems all to brief;
