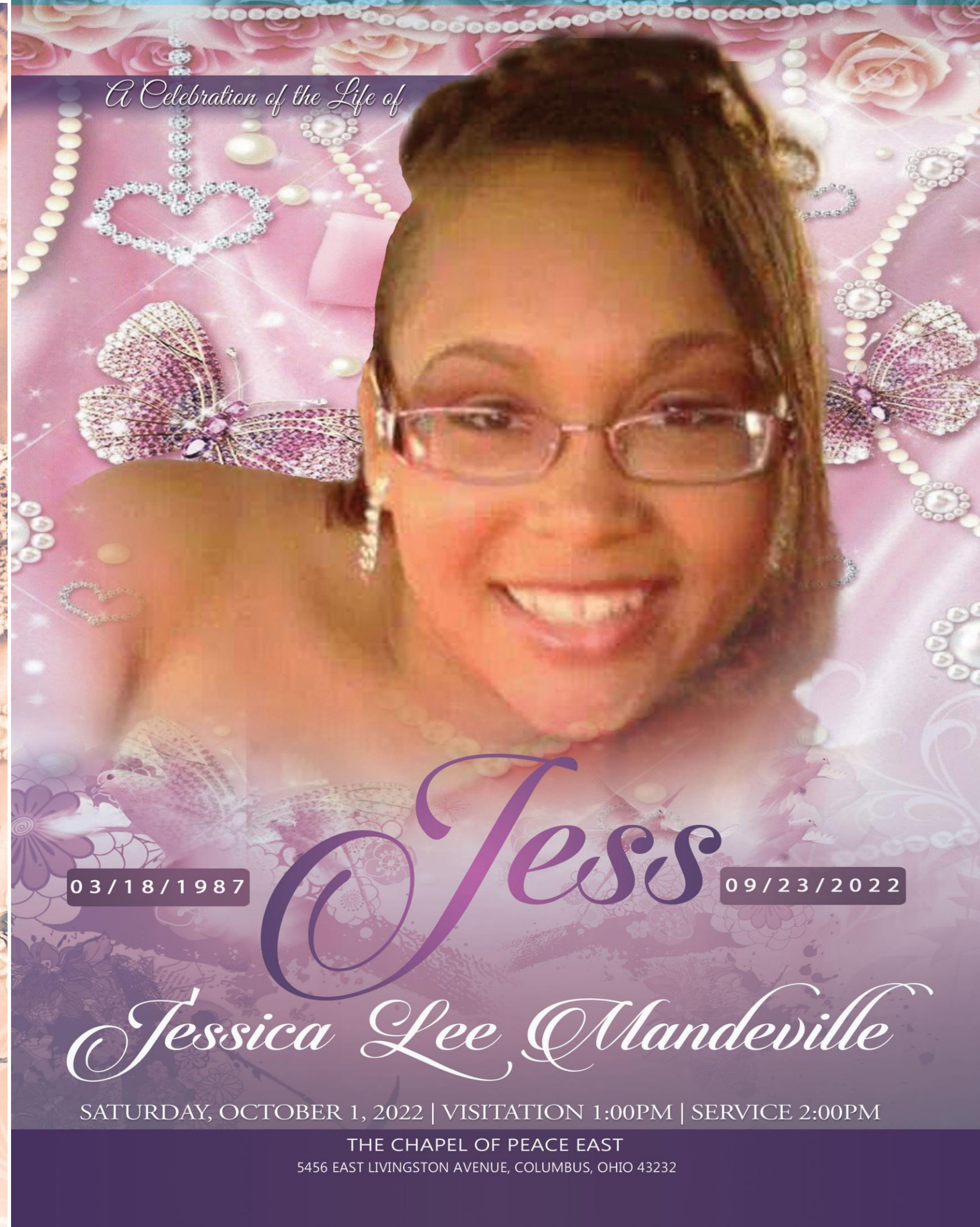

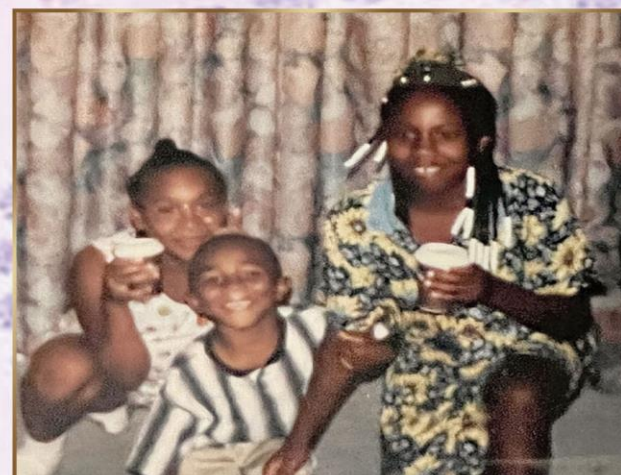

She loved to cook and eat Italian and was mastering the art of making homemade pasta. Jess's bright smile and contagious laughter was infectious and would shift the whole atmosphere in a room.

In September 2012, Jess received a kidney and pancreas transplant. She was a spokesperson for the Kidney Foundation and participated in several kidney walks. Due to the gift of life she received, Jess was compelled to become an organ donor.

On Friday, September 23, 2022, Jess transitioned to be with the Lord. On Sunday, September 25, 2022, at ST. Ann's Mount Carmel Hospital, her liver was given to save another life. Her lungs were donated to OSU for research and teaching purposes. Even in rest, Jess was still giving.

Jess was preceded in death by her maternal grandmother, Jean Ann Byrd and her cousin, Major Eric Stovall.

She leaves to cherish her parents, paternal grandfather; Lincoln T. Mandeville, grandmother; Linda J. Mandeville, aunts; Maria Garner (Ray), Erica Mandeville, uncles; J.R. Byrd (Susan), Brian Byrd (Beth), Jason Mandeville (Nicole), and Charles Napper, godmother; Kirsten Hinton (Wendell), godfather; Larry Balfour, several godchildren and a host of relatives and friends.
