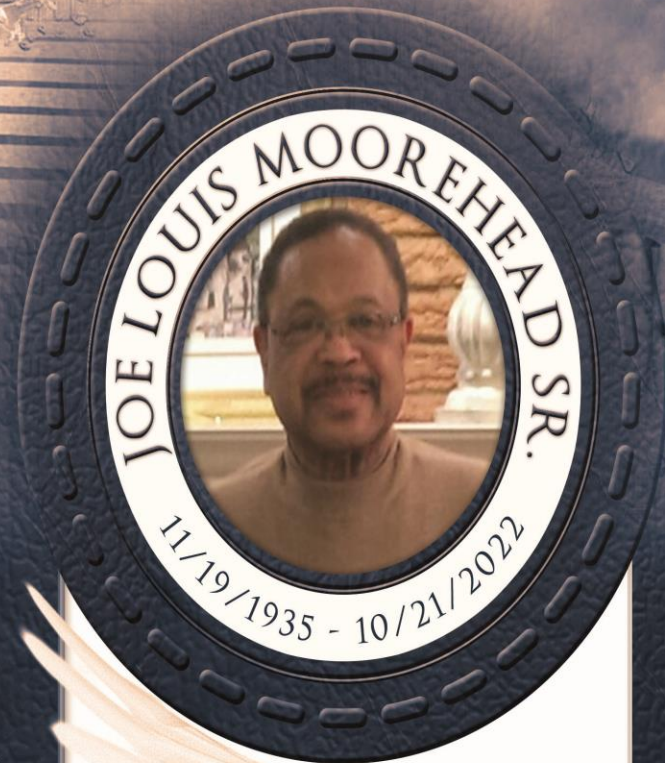

God wanted me now - He set me free.*



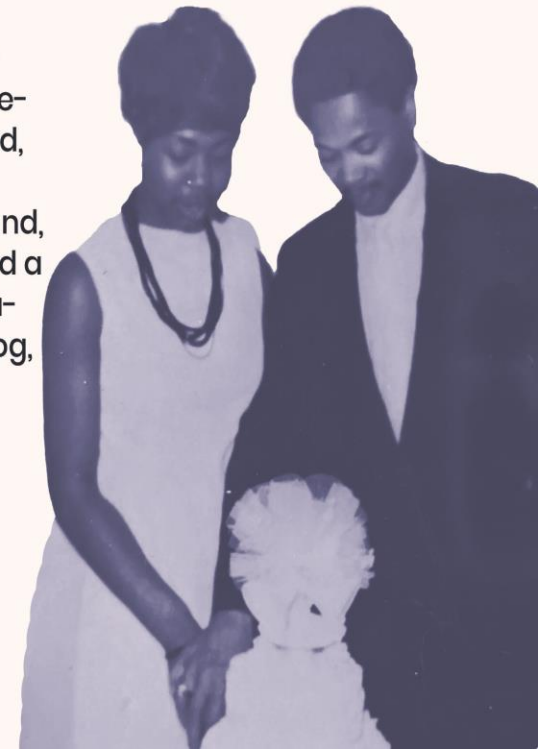

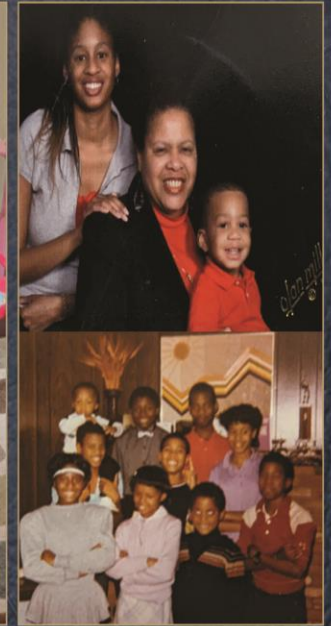
