Love "Blue Lewis"*

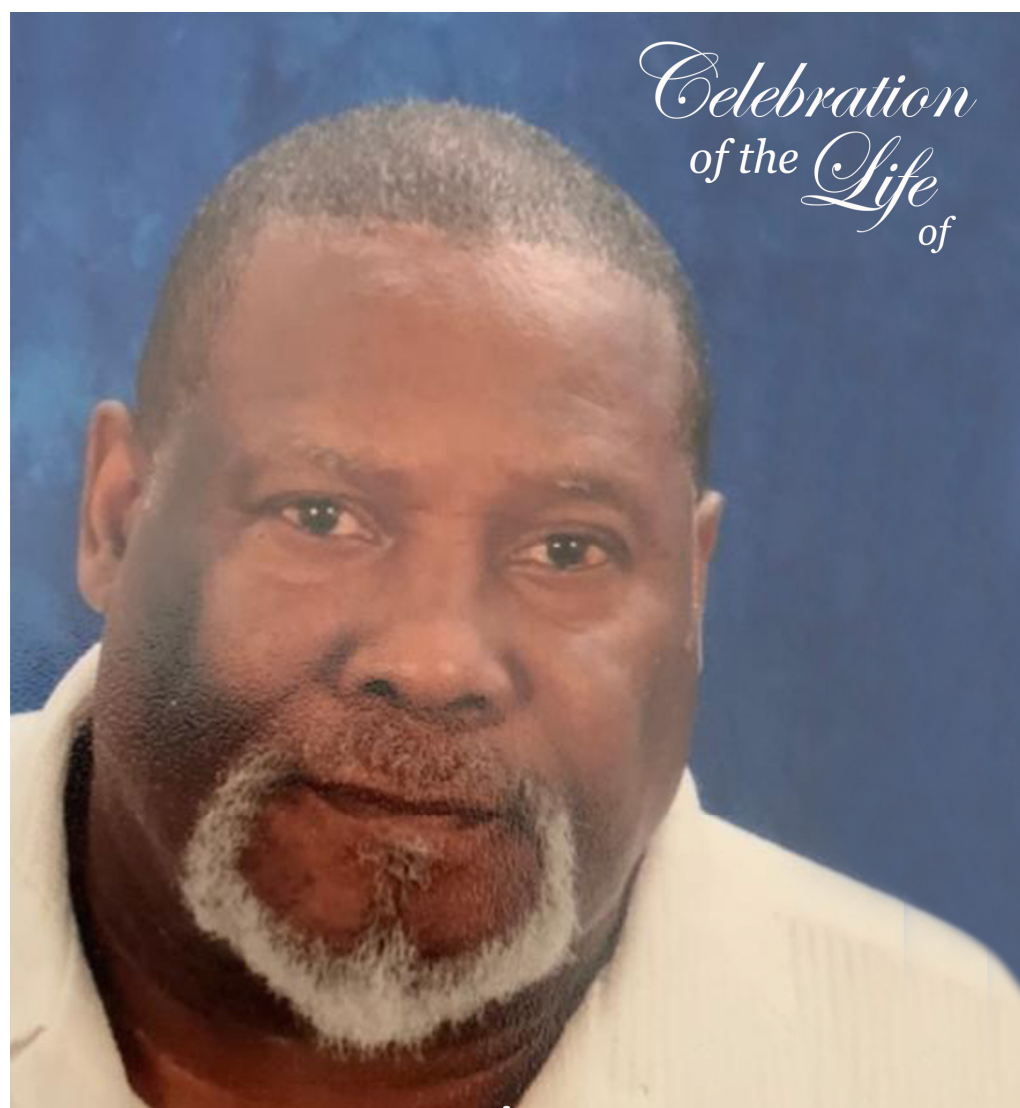
