Obituary

She later attended Greater Emmanuel Apostolic Faith Church under Bishop Charles Grant and finally joined Greater Emmanuel Apostolic Church of God (Higher Ground) under Bishop Sherman S. Watkins where she remained until her passing. She served on the Mother's Board and Hospitality Committee. She was a faithful member of the Nurse' Corp and she sang in the Agape Choir until age 72. Nora Dean (Sister Deanie) was well loved and she was everyone's grandmother.

Nora Dean married Charles Burger on Saturday, December 15, 1973, and they enjoyed life, each other and their family until his passing in 2006. Nora Dean was also preceded in death by her parents; Samuel and Gertrude Marie Scott, sisters; Mildred Holiday and Mary Travis, son; Maceo Banner, grandsons; Macrino Craft and George Ellis.
