The day God called you home*

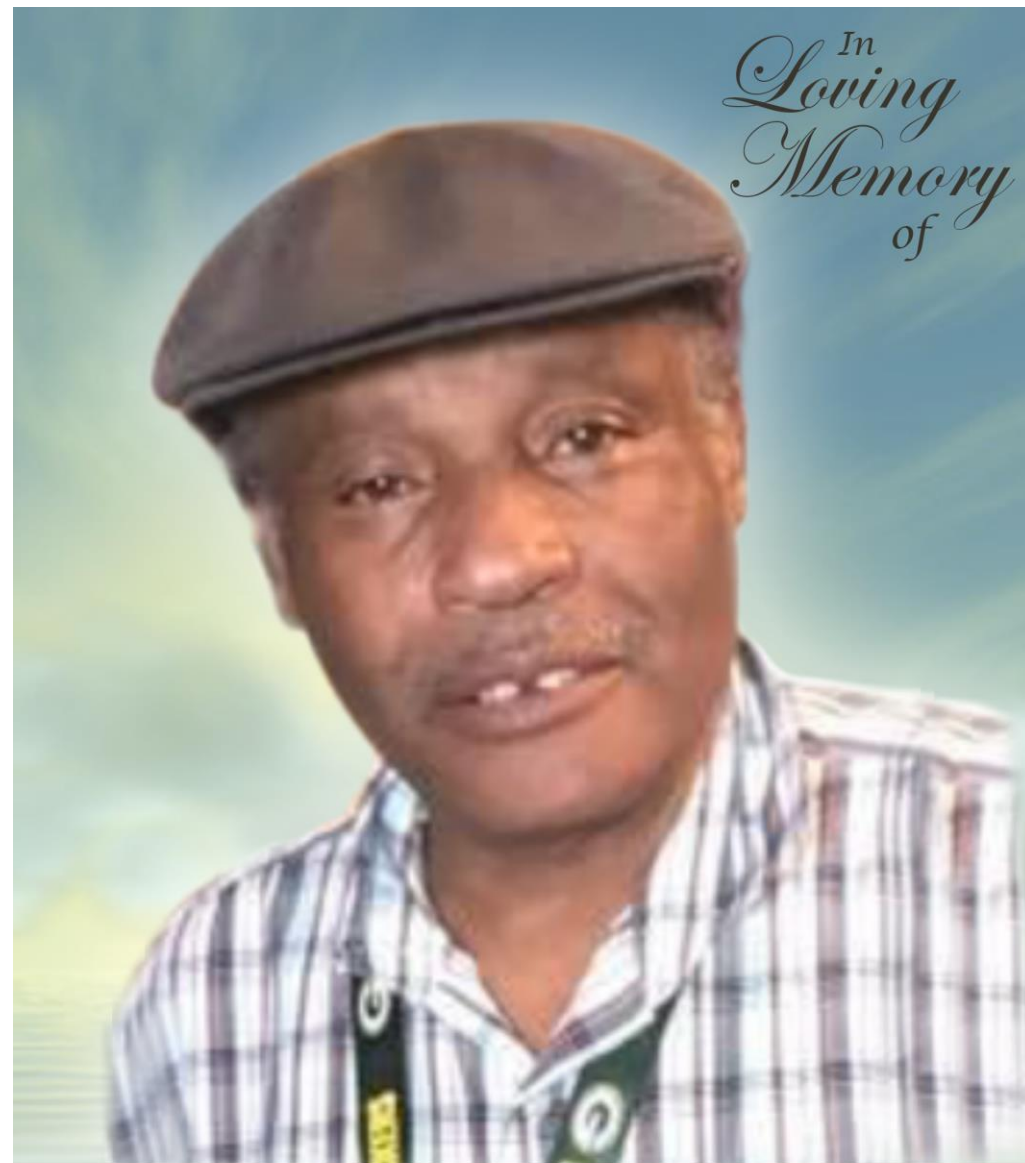
*You left us beautiful memories
