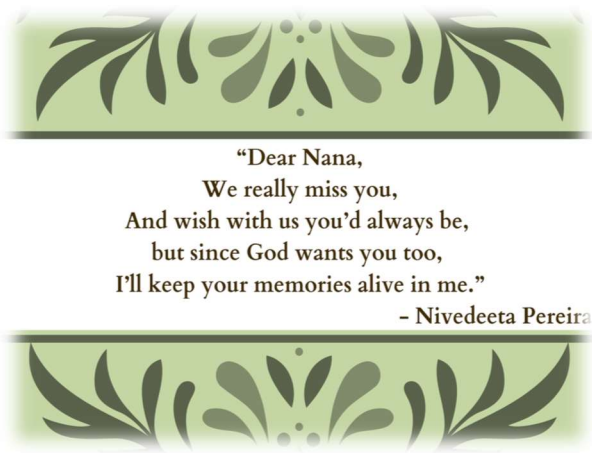
The Obituary
