## "Come with Me"

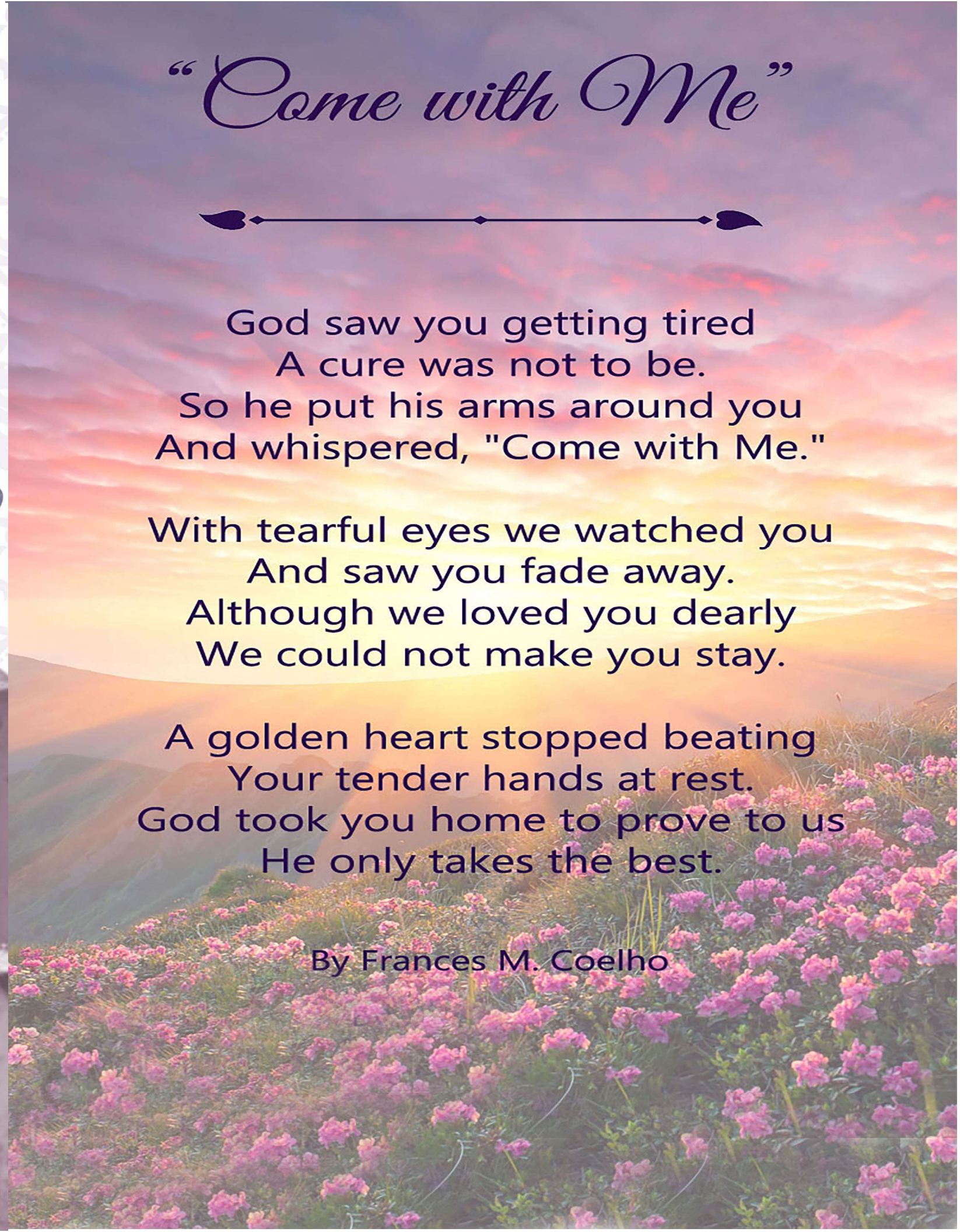


God saw you getting tired
