God took you home to prove to us

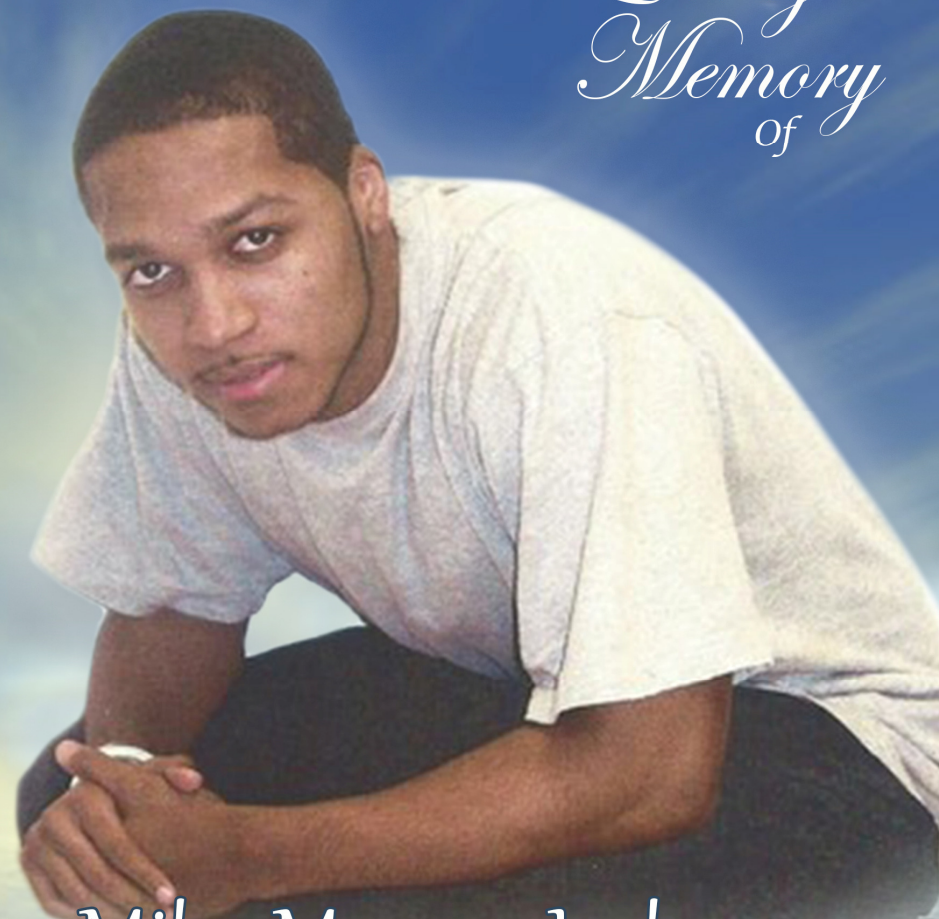
