Melvin McCoy transitioned from this life on Saturday, September 4, 2021, in Ohio Health Hospital in Mansfield, Ohio.

Melvin was born November 26, 1949 in Mansfield to Leon and Gladys McCoy. He was known as an exceptional pitcher and shortstop while growing up and playing baseball for International Stove, Parker TV, and Tappan. He and his brother, Charles, also enjoyed driving their mustangs in their youth. On February 19, 1980, Melvin married Angelith (Angie) after a previous marriage to Pamela Johnson. Melvin worked as a laborer at Mansfield Tire & Rubber and other factories before settling in at Frito-Lay, Inc. in Wooster, Ohio where he worked for 17 years. He was a member of Teamsters Local Union No. 52 and he carried his union card in his wallet until his last day.

Before and after he retired, Melvin cared for his wife, Angie, who became disabled in 2004. They spent much of their remaining time together cooking, sitting in the den of their home, talking about current events, laughing, telling stories, and watching sports, especially on Saturdays when they could watch their favorite team, The Ohio State Buckeyes.

Melvin is survived by his step-mother, Mary McCoy; four sons, one daughter, and one daughter-in-law, Jeffrey L. McCoy and Amanda McCoy, both of Mansfield, K.C. McCoy of Columbus, Austin McCoy of Auburn, Alabama, and Brandenn McCoy of Mansfield; four grandchildren, Shea McCoy-Sanderfer and Malik McCoy, both of Columbus, Dryden L. McCoy and Lennon O. McCoy, both of Columbus; and two great grandchildren, Myron Sanderfer III and Joy Sanderfer, both of Columbus.
